

## **BEXHILL NURSE'S WAR SERVICE.**

Miss Ethel Bray, a sister in Queen Alexandra's Imperial military order of Nurses, will, on Tuesday next, have completed two years of War service in hospitals and hospital ships, during the first four months with the British Army in France, 18 months on the largest hospital ships, and for the last two months in Egypt. In the early winter of 1914-15 she crossed the English Channel 80 times in the conveyance of wounded and returning, after which Miss Bray was appointed to proceed to Gallipoli, from whence and Sulva Bay she has travelled with wounded soldiers in the Aegean Sea to Alexandria, Malta, Naples and Port Said, fifteen voyages each way, also five out to the East and home to England, altogether a sea mileage of 70,000. This week Sister Ethel has resumed duty in a large military hospital at home, after a short leave spent with her father and family at Bexhill.
